The focus on Spanish-English and Native Languages-English books and authors makes this festival particularly meaningful and vibrant, reflecting the identities of many children in New Mexico and the Southwest. We want to encourage children to see themselves in contemporary children's literature as well as introduce a bilingual body of work to a wider audience.

The festival also launches a summer program that pairs children who need help with reading with tutors who will provide one-on-one and group reading tutoring over the summer.

ABOUT THE AUTHORS & WORKSHOPS

NASARIO GARCÍA (9-9:30) is a native New Mexican who received his Ph.D. from the University of Pittsburgh in XIX century Spanish literature. Folklorist, oral historian, short story writer, and poet, he has published over thirty books. His latest are No More Bingo, Comadrel Stories (UNM Press 2018) and, Grandma Lale's Magical Adobe Oven/El adobe mágico de Abuelita Lale (Río Grande Books, 2019). Dr. García is the recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award by the Historical Society of New Mexico.

WORKSHOP FOR TEACHERS (11-Noon): "Windows, Mirrors, and Doors: Culturally Relevant Literacy Resources for the Classroom." Diverse books are integral when building a classroom setting where culturally relevant learning takes place year round. This presentation will provide an overview of the world of diversity in children's literature, identify tools for critically analyzing titles, and share ideas for how to find books that provide empowering and eye-opening reading experiences for students of all backgrounds. DR. KATRINA DILLON is the K-12 educational consultant for the Latin American and Iberian Institute at UNM and earned her MA in Latin American Studies and her Ph.D. in Language, Literacy, and Sociocultural Studies at UNM. She is currently a teacher with Albuquerque Public Schools.

NANCY BO FLOOD (Noon-12:30) is the author of several books for children, including *Cowboy Upl Riding the Navajo Rodeo* (Boyds Mill Press, 2013) which was honored as a 2014 NCTE Notable Poetry Book, a 2013 California Reading Association Eureka! Nonfiction honor book, and given the Arizona-New Mexico book award for juvenile literature. Her most recent books are *First Laugh, Welcome Baby* (Charlesbridge, 2018) and *Soldier Sister, Fly Home* (Charlesbridge, 2017) . Nancy lives in Arizona and Colorado. PAUL AND CARLOS MEYER (2-2:45): Under the Cottonwood Tree: El Susto de la curandera is a graphic novel written by Paul Meyer & Carlos Meyer and illustrated by Margaret Hardy. In decades past, amongst the cottonwood trees and near the Rio Grande, lies the sleepy little village known as Algodones, New Mexico, where simple villagers live their simple lives. Step onto the trail following la curandera and join Carlos, Amadeo and best friend Monree as they experience an adventure of a lifetime while unraveling the many secrets of the bosque.

ANNA NOGAR and ENRIQUE LAMADRID (3-3:45) are co-authors of Sisters in Blue/
Hermanas de azul (UNM Press, 2017), based on 17th-century nun Sor María de Jesús de Ágreda. Dr. NOGAR is Associate Professor of Hispanic Southwest Studies in the Department of Spanish and Portuguese at the University of New Mexico. She is the author or editor of several books, including Quill and Cross in the Borderlands: Sor María de Ágreda, 1628- the Present (U. of Notre Dame Press, 2018), A History of Mexican Literature (Cambridge U. Press, 2016) and the forthcoming El feliz ingenio neomexicano: The Life and Writing of Felipe M. Chacón. Enrique R. LAMADRID is a Professor in the Department of Spanish and Portuguese at UNM. He teaches folklore, literature, and cultural history. His children's books include Amadito y los Niños Héroes / Amadito and the Hero Children (UNM Press, 2011) and, with Juan Estevan Arellano, Juan the Bear and the Water of Life: La acequia de Juan del Oso. (UNM Press, 2008).

POESÍA ERES TÚ (4-4:30) is an annual competition organized by the Institute Cervantes and the UNM Latin American Iberian Institute in which elementary students recite memorized, dramatized poems in Spanish. The students come from public, private, and charter schools. This presentation features winners of the 2019 competition held on April 26. The event is organized in collaboration with the Spanish Resource Center of Albuquerque, Instituto Cervantes of Albuquerque, and the National Hispanic Cultural Center.

ZAHRA MARWAN created the art for our beautiful festival image, t-shirts and posters. Zahra grew up in two deserts which vary drastically and have many similarities in culture. One close to the sea, the other close to the mountains. She studied the visual arts in France, and continues various pursuits to further educate herself.
