LAI Field Research Grant (FRG): the LAI FRG is available to graduate students across campus to conduct pilot studies and preliminary investigations in Latin America.

UISFL Field Research Awards: The UISFL Field Research Awards support undergraduate students working with a UNM faculty member on an internationally based project to support travel to the field.

Fulbright US Study Program: The Fulbright program is the largest U.S. exchange program offering opportunities for students and young professionals to undertake international graduate study, advanced research, university teaching, and primary and secondary school teaching worldwide.

Boren Awards: Boren Awards support the study of critical languages and cultural field studies of world regions that are underrepresented in study abroad.

Critical Language Scholarship (CLS): CLS provides opportunities for American college and university students to study languages and cultures essential to America's engagement with the world.

Benjamin A. Gilman International Scholarship: The Gilman Scholarship Program enables students of limited financial means to study or intern abroad, providing them with skills critical to our national security and economic prosperity. To be eligible for the Gilman Program, applicants must be receiving a Federal Pell Grant.

Freeman-Asia Program: The Freeman-Asia Program supports U.S.-based undergraduates with demonstrated financial need who are planning to study abroad in East or Southeast Asia.
